User Manual

Overview

Profit Radar Scheduler is your automation steward for affiliate marketing, launch jacking, content scheduling, and side-hustle discovery.

It helps you create, manage, and control recurring research or publishing automations all in plain language without the need for confusing interfaces and learning a new system.

Getting Started

When you start a new session, you'll be greeted with:

1. A brief overview of what the Scheduler does.
2. A request for your focus markets (e.g., Health, Manifestation, Make Money Online, Hobby).
3. A request for your timezone (defaults to America/New_York if not provided).

Then, you'll see a list of default automation sets (all turned OFF by default).

Example prompt: "Would you like to enable any of these, or create a custom one?"

Automations Overview

Each automation has:

- Title – its name.
- Instruction – what it does when it runs.
- Schedule – how often it runs.
- Timezone – for scheduling consistency.
- Status – ON (active) or OFF (paused).
- Next Run – the next scheduled date/time.
- ID – unique reference for commands.

NOTES:

Enable ChatGPT notifications to get alerted when your automations have completed. Click your profile picture > settings > notifications. Set tasks to Push/Email or your preference.

Default Settings

Frequency: Daily
Time: 9:00 AM
Timezone: EST
Status: OFF
Minimum Recurrence: 1 run per day

Basic Commands

Use natural language — the Scheduler understands plain English.

List

Shows all automations with ID, title, status, and schedule.

Example: “List my automations.”

Start / Enable

Turns an automation ON.

Example: “Start A1.” or “Enable WarriorPlus Scanner.”

Stop / Pause

Turns an automation OFF.

Example: “Stop Launch Brief Builder.”

Remove

Deletes an automation permanently (requires confirmation).

Example: “Remove JVZoo Trends.”

Rename

Changes an automation’s title.

Example: “Rename Launch Tracker to Daily Launch Radar.”

Change Time / Frequency

Updates when or how often it runs.

Examples:

“Change the time for Content Briefs to 7:30 AM daily.”

“Make Launch Tracker weekly on Mondays at noon.”

Revise Instruction

Updates what the automation does when it runs.

Example: “Change the instruction for Launch Tracker to also include creator names and links.”

Reset to Defaults*

Deletes all user automations and reloads the default library (all OFF).

Example: “Reset to defaults.”

*Be careful, this will nuke any custom instructions and can’t be undone.

Creating a New Automation

You can create one from scratch using a simple natural-language request.

Example:

“Create a new one: Every weekday at 8 AM, scan WarriorPlus upcoming launches and summarize sellers, launch dates, and funnel steps with links.”

If any detail is missing (e.g., time, day, or timezone), you’ll be asked one concise follow-up question.

Once complete, you’ll get a confirmation block:

Title: WarriorPlus Launch Scanner

Instruction: Scan upcoming WarriorPlus launches and summarize sellers, dates, and funnel steps with links.

Schedule: Weekdays at 8:00 AM

Timezone: America/New_York

Status: OFF

Next run: (not scheduled until turned ON)

ID: A5

Managing Automations

After creation, you can:

- Enable or disable any automation.
- Change its schedule or instruction.
- Rename or remove it entirely.
- Reset all to the default library.

All changes are confirmed back in a compact summary for clarity.

Tips for Best Use

1. Enable Desktop Notifications to stay aware of updates when automations run.
2. Keep It Simple — use daily or weekly cadences for reliable insights.
3. Do Your Due Diligence — public data can change; always verify markets manually.
4. Balance Volume and Focus — a few high-value automations outperform dozens of noisy ones.

Example Workflow

1. Start with: “List default automations.”
2. Enable one: “Start Affiliate Launch Radar.”
3. Create a new one: “Every weekday at 7 AM, scan ClickBank’s top offers and summarize those in Health and Wealth niches.”
4. Adjust timing: “Change the time for Affiliate Launch Radar to 8:30 AM.”
5. Review: “List my automations.”

Troubleshooting

Automation didn’t run — Status OFF → Use “Start [title]” to enable it.

Wrong time — Timezone mismatch → Confirm timezone or specify explicitly.

Missing data — Source restricted → Verify external source manually.

Too frequent runs — Sub-hour schedule → Reduce cadence to at least daily.

Safety & Boundaries

- Nothing runs automatically without consent.
- All automations default to OFF.
- External actions (emailing, posting) are not performed unless supported.
- Sources behind logins or paywalls are skipped.
- Warns if a cadence shorter than 15 minutes is requested.
- Will never take the last slice of pizza

Style & Tone

Responses are:

- Clear and calm

- Focused on outcomes (research, publishing, or content creation)
- Always confirmed before activation
